Program: "Folded Wreath" presented by Betsy O'Neill

Betsy O'Neill from Lake County will lead us in creating a folded wreath pattern (see separate photo). You may want to make one with either a fall or a Christmas theme or maybe one for a patriotic season or another holiday. Betsy has been quilting for over 20 years. She has taught classes at Sew-Mini Things in Mount Dora and also does samples for the store. A winner of several awards at the Lake County Quilters Guild, Betsy has held positions in the guild as President, Vice President, and has served as Quilt Show Chair four times.

For the wreath you will need:

- Three 1/2 yard fabrics. Sub cut two (2) of these into twelve (12) 7" squares.
- The third fabric will be your center and should be cut into twelve (12) 5 1/2 " squares.
- You will need twelve (12) 6" squares of batting and 1 yard of Pellex ultra firm sew-in stabilizer.
- Bring your sewing machine and sewing supplies (scissors, pins etc.)

If you are interested in participating, Dee Duckworth would be happy to conduct another exchange at the May meeting, but she needs to know how many people would like to take part.
